DETAILED METHODOLOGY

- The survey was conducted on behalf of the International Republican Institute's Center for Insights in Survey Research by the Independent Research Institute of Mongolia (IRIM).
- Data collection was conducted between March 11 - April 20, 2021 through computer-assisted telephone interviews (CATI) from IRIM's call center.
- The sample consisted of n=2,520 residents of Mongolia aged 18 and over.
- A multi-stage probability sampling method was used to design a nationally representative sample. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the data collection was conducted based on a CATI. The contact information list of the households was compiled from the IRIM's internal database. The sample was stratified by region and by urban/rural residency. Households were selected by simple random sampling, and respondents were selected by the last birthday method.
- The data was weighted by gender and age groups based on the NSO data for population of Mongolia.
- The response rate was 27 percent.
- The margin of error for the full sample is ± 1.92 percentage points.
- Charts and graphs may not add up to 100 percent due to rounding.




In general, would you say that our country is heading in the right direction or in the wrong direction?






How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the way democracy is developing in our country?


Speaking personally, over the past 6 months, how has your overall quality of life changed?




What is the most important problem facing our country today?



Through what activities can ordinary people influence decisions made in our country?




Through what activities can ordinary people influence decisions made in our country?







Do you agree or disagree that political parties are doing enough to address the needs of voters like you?

Do you believe that democracy is the best possible form of government for our country or not?








To what extent, if any, has corruption had a negative impact on you?






In the past 12 months, how often, if at all, have you had to do a favor, give a gift or pay a bribe?








Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?

(Up to three responses permitted)




Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?





Which media platform do you use most frequently to gain political news and information?




How frequently do you encounter information in the media, including social media, that you believe is misleading or false?






To what extent is misleading or false information in the media problematic for our country?






Which of the following do you think is the main force behind such misleading or false information?






